MODEL OF CARE

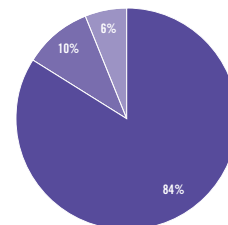
Our nonpunitive Value-Based Therapeutic Environment (VBTE) model has earned a “promising” rating on CrimeSolutions.org, a national database of evidence-based treatment plans that are proven to work.

- VBTE teaches pro-social behaviors through a common set of values, skills, therapeutic activities and intervention tools.
- VBTE customizes each youth’s treatment plan with input from teachers, parents and court counselors.

OTHER FACTS FY 2014–15

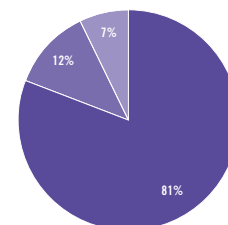
- 1,275 clients: 1,079 children and 196 families
